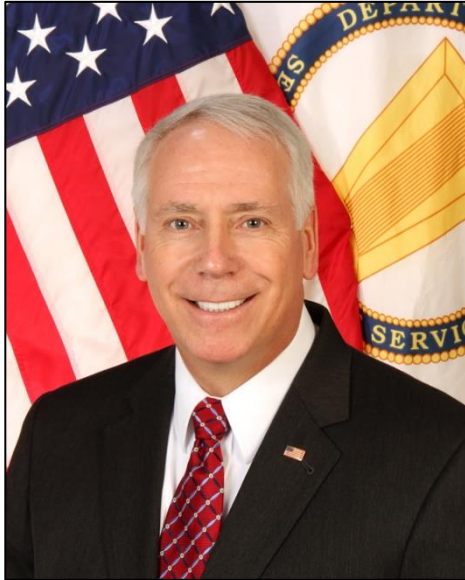

Charles R. Alexander, Jr.

Mr. Charles R. Alexander, Jr. (*Ray*) is the Superintendent of Arlington National Cemetery. As Superintendent, he oversees all aspects of the daily administration, operations, and maintenance of the two Army National Military Cemeteries – Arlington National Cemetery and the Soldier's and Airmen's Home National Cemetery. He is responsible for the care and maintenance of 639 acres, approximately 7,000 annual funeral services, the visitor experience of nearly 4 million annual visitors, over 220 civilian and military employees, and more than \$155M dollars in construction and operating funds.

As Superintendent, Mr. Alexander serves as an Army liaison to the Department of Veterans Affairs, the American Battle Monuments Commission, the National Park Service, and the Military Women's Memorial to develop strategic partnerships, improve support to veterans and their families, and enhance the overall family and visitor experience at Arlington.

Appointed to the Senior Executive Service in November 2014, Mr. Alexander has over 44 years of combined federal and private sector experience. Previously he served as the Director of Contingency Operations and Chief, Office of Homeland Security, Headquarters, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Washington, D.C.

Mr. Alexander became a Department of the Army Civilian in 2011, serving at Headquarters, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, initially as the Deputy Operations Officer (G3) followed by service as the Deputy Chief, Office of Homeland Security. From 2013-2014 he was Senior Director for Response Policy on the National Security Council Staff, in the Executive Office of the President. Before joining civil service, Mr. Alexander was in the private sector for over 5 years. He retired from the U.S. Army at the rank of Colonel in 2005 after more than 28 years of service.
